


# Pupil Information Plans, Support Plans and Health and Care Plans

United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child UNCRC Articles 28 and 29 focus on a child's right to an education and on the quality and content of education

Article 29 focuses on the aims of education and says that governments agree that "the education of the child shall be directed to:

- The development of the child's personality, talents and mental and physical abilities to their fullest potential.
- The development of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms and the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations.
- The development of respect for the child's parents, his or her own cultural identity, language, and values, for the national values of the country in which the child is living, the country from which he or she may originate and for civilisations different from his or her own.
- The preparation of the child for responsible life in a free society in the spirit of understanding, peace, tolerance, equality of sexes and friendship among all peoples, ethnic, national and religious groups and persons of indigenous origin.
- The development of respect for the natural environment.

At South Park Nursery we will ask each family to complete a pupil information plan. This will ensure we know your child as you know them, and we can provide the best support tailored to them.

Should a child have any other needs, or we identify ways in which we can support them further in the setting we will then, along side parents and carers implement a support plan with strategies put in place to work on both in the nursery and at home. This will be reviewed regularly with new targets set as they progress, or possibly new strategies put in place to support.

Some children will also require a health plan. This will ensure all practitioners at the nursery have the knowledge to support children to the fullest. Again, this will be reviewed regularly and be completed with practitioners and families.

Should any medical risks be possible a medical risk assessment will be filled out and placed in the child's file. This ensures all staff are aware of the risks involved and how to deal with any incidents should they occur.

## **Health and Social Care Standard (HSCS)**

**4.15 I experience stability in my care and support from people who know my needs, choices and wishes even if there are changes in the service or organisation.**

**4.16 I am supported and cared for by people I know so that I experience consistency and continuity.**

## Contents

1. **Pupil Information and individual Care Plan** - all children have one, filled in by parents with support if required at induction sessions - updated termly and signed by all practitioners.
2. **Admission form** (All Children)
3. **Chronology** (All Children)
4. **Support and Intervention Plan** (some children as discussed with EYSP requiring additional support. This will be updated termly and reviewed alongside parents)
5. **Health Plan** (Some children)
6. **Medical Risk Assessment** (Some Children - when medication is required, and procedures need to be in place if risks are probable)
