- Art and craft activities are excellent activities for building fine-motor skills, developing dexterity, and improving hand-eye co-ordination.
- Provides time to discuss, extend and model language, problem solve and encourages teamwork and improves memory.
- Allows for self-expression using a variety of different materials whilst also building confidence.
- Scissors skills are pre-writing activities and children become accustomed to using them, build strength but also become aware of risks staff naturally encourage children to use scissors in a variety of ways (textures, materials etc) both indoors and outdoors, however children are always reminded of how to walk safely whilst holding scissors and provide praise when achieved.
- Children are exposed to measured risk on a day-to-day basis. They are supported by qualified practitioners before and during any activity deemed to be 'risky' until eventually children become aware of how to manage the risk enabling a rich quality experience.
- Children are proud and welcomed to display any artwork sharing their achievements on 'the gallery', in profiles or to take home.
